Dear Readers, Moved With Compassion

It is really an understatement to say that we are commissioned to evangelize for Christ. Yes, the Lord Jesus Christ did give us the Great Commission in Matthew 28:19, 20 to make disciples of all nations with promise of His presence expressed thus, "lo, I am with you alway, even unto the end of the world. Amen." (28:20b). But it doesn't stop there. Underlying the Great Commission is the love of God constraining us to go and make disciples of all nations and to teach them the word of God.

The Apostle Paul in Romans 5:5 reminds us that "the love of God is shed abroad in our hearts by the Holy Ghost which is given unto us." It was the love of God that sent His only Begotten Son, the Lord Jesus Christ into this sinful world for our redemption. The key verse of the Bible is John 3:16, "For God so loved the world, that He gave His only begotten Son, that whosoever believeth in Him should not perish, but have everlasting life." And this is the love of God that has regenerated our hearts by the Holy Spirit by whom we have been sealed unto eternity. (Ephesians 1:13)

This love of God "shed abroad in our hearts" constrains us to love Him because He first loved us. And we are commanded to do so with all our heart, soul, mind and strength. (Mark 12:30) It constrains us that "whether therefore ye eat, or drink, or whatsoever ye do, do all to the glory of God." (1 Corinthians 10:31) God's glory must be our ultimate goal!

As the redeemed of God, God's love in us must move us with the same compassion the Lord Jesus had when He saw the multitude as being "scattered abroad, as sheep having no shepherd" when He issued the call that "the harvest truly is plenteous, but the labourers are few; Pray ye therefore the Lord of the harvest, that he will send forth labourers into his harvest." (Matthew 9:36-38)

Yes, the harvest truly is plenteous. There are still so many without Christ, heading for a hopeless eternity in the lake of fire "prepared for the devil and his angels." (Matthew 25:41).

Let us invite our friends and relatives to our worship services on Sundays. Let us not forget to pray for them that they will come to the New Life B-P Church services and hear the Word preached and perchance, be saved as the Spirit of God work in their hearts. Let us pray for the speakers that the gospel may be made plain and that the Holy Spirit will work in the heart of all those who would come and that as many as are ordained to eternal life might believe and be saved. (Acts 13:48) And through it all, the Lord be glorified!

Just as the heavens echo praises unto our God the Almighty, may it also fill our hearts with joy to see one lost sinner come to repentance and faith in Jesus Christ.

#### Q & A

### How does Satan influence our minds today and what can a Christian do about it?

That is a good question concerning the subtle occultic and malevolent work of the evil one that has intensified in the last days. I am convinced that one of the main battlefields for the Christian is the mind today.

One of the avenues where Satan can attack the mind is through drugs which adversely affect the neurological functions of the mind causing one to be "high" and later depressed or even suicidal.

The second way is through alcohol which depresses or suppresses the mental capacity and one loses control of oneself and that is why intoxicated people often say strange things or could not walk properly.

Thirdly, it is through secular music, which can be a powerful agent to saturate our minds and create an obsessive compulsive behaviour if we are exposed to it for a long period of time. That is why heavy-metal or rock music which can be addictive has led some to chronic depression or suicide or even abusive or violent behaviour if one is constantly exposed to it over a longer period of time (1 Cor 6:12).

Fourthly, it is through the mass media of the TV, internet, billboards, movies, videos and magazines. These avenues saturated our minds with their powerful images and create a lasting negative impact in our consciousness. We need to engage our minds to the truth of God by meditating on the word of God, in listening to edifying Christian music, in Christian conversation and fellowship with the saints and regular Sabbath worship and prayer (Heb 10:24,25). These will counter the diabolical influence of the evil one. Paul...

challenges us in Rom 12:1,2 saying, "I beseech you therefore, brethren, by the mercies of God, that ye present your bodies a living sacrifice, holy, acceptable unto God, which is your reasonable service. And be not conformed to this world: but be ye transformed by the renewing of your mind, that ye may prove what is that good, and acceptable, and perfect, will of God."

Paul warned us to consciously beware or remove certain unedifyina ianore or thoughts and to bring them under the control of Christ. 2 Cor 10:5 says, "Casting down imaginations, and every high thing that exalteth itself against the knowledge of God, and bringing into captivity every thought to the obedience of Christ;" And positively we are to make a conscious effort to pray and fill our minds with the thoughts that will glorify God or edify our souls. One need to be disciplined and temperate in our thought life. Phil 4:6-8 says, "Be careful for nothing; but in every thing by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known unto God. And the peace of God, which passeth all understanding, shall keep your hearts and minds through Christ Jesus. Finally, brethren, whatsoever things are whatsoever things honest. true. are whatsoever things are just, whatsoever things are pure, whatsoever things are lovely, whatsoever things are of good report; if there be any virtue, and if there be any praise, think on these things."

Resolve to be disciplined and concentrate your mind on God and heavenly things. The secret to a peaceful and calm mind against all the worldly strife and confusion of the day is found in Isa 26:3,4, "Thou wilt keep him in perfect peace, whose mind is stayed on thee: because he trusteth in thee. Trust ye in the LORD for ever: for in the LORD JEHOVAH is everlasting strength:"

MORNING

LUKE 6:13 "And when it was day, he called unto him his disciples: and of them he chose twelve, whom also he named apostles;"

JESUS was a friend to everybody. Yet He chose twelve men whom He took into very close companionship. These men made up His personal family. He received from them the blessings of friendship, which all men need in their busy life.

The chief reason why He chose the twelve, however, was that He might train them, so that when He was gone they could carry on His work. He still went about speaking the words of life to the multitudes, but He gave the most of His time and thought to those He had chosen. They were to be His witnesses, and must see His life and hear His words, in order that they might be capable witnesses.

We should note that Jesus spent the whole night in prayer before choosing His friends. In nothing do we need more to pray than when we are choosing our friends and companions. If there was more prayer for wisdom and guidance in the forming of friendships, there would be less regret and fewer heart-breaks afterwards.
