My dear readers,

In God We Trust

"Some trust in chariots, and some in horses: but we will remember the name of the LORD our God." (Psalm 20: 7)

In the book of Ecclesiastes, we have Solomon's written sermon, from which we draw precious insight into practical Christian living. Issues on life and death are real. Here in Ecclesiastes 9, Solomon turned from discussion of death to life.

Law of the Jungle

Since death is inevitable, for it is appointed unto man, once to die, man tends to focus on what is perceived as tangibly important. We major in strength, riches, health and beauty. Hence, we witness a struggle for political clout, a scramble for wealth and a desire for bodily preservation.

This behaviour is the product of the law of the jungle – the survival of the fittest. It is generally true that the fleetest foot wins the race, the powerful receives esteem and the brilliant mind is rewarded with academic accolades. In the light of such observation, it is understandable for man's emphasis on these tangible goals.

Realities of Life

Be that as it may, the realities of life tell us otherwise. Firstly, these material emphases have no lasting value. Pleasures and power are for a season. Empires wax and wane, kings and queens come and go; health ebbs and beauty fade away. "All flesh is grass, and all the goodliness thereof is as the flower of the field: The grass withereth, the flower fadeth: but the word of our God shall stand for ever" (Isaiah 40: 6 & 8).

Secondly, we cannot predict the turning point of our fortune – from riches to rags; from hero to villain and from public acclamation to irrevocable oblivion!

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Perspective in life

Given these indisputable realities, God through Solomon gave us two inspiring thoughts – Ecclesiastes 9: 11,12.

Ecclesiastes 9: 11

"...The race is not to the swift, not the battle to the strong, neither yet bread to the wise, nor yet riches to men of understanding, nor yet favour to men of skill; but time and chance happeneth to them all."

Is it not true that the same people who are talented and well endowed can fail miserably because of factors outside their control? We do not need to look very hard for such examples where the even best horse stumbles!

Ecclesiastes 9: 12

"For man also knoweth not his time: as the fishes that are taken in an evil net, and as the birds that are caught in the snare; so are the sons of men snared in an evil time, when it falleth suddenly upon them."

Just as fish are caught in net and birds in their traps, as they take the bait, man too can be thus ensnared. Who knows when trouble will rear its ugly head and thwart all the great plans he has envisaged.

Man proposes but God disposes. "The lot is cast into the lap; but the whole disposing thereof is of the Lord" (Proverbs 16: 33).

What Do We Do?

Remember only the Lord can control "time and chance" (Ecclesiastes 9: 11). Chance happens to all of us. The chance that we understand is not apart from God and not in competition with God, but rather, it is the providence of the good and gracious God.

The winning of a race, the victory in a battle, the success in any human enterprise, I emphasize, do not lie within the resources of man. They are, I humbly submit, outside the purview of man and fall within the providence of God.

As we enter into the year 2007, let us lean upon our Lord for strength and wisdom. He has said, "Without me you can do nothing" (John 15: 5).

As for EBPC, let us begin the year, humbled by these words of counsel – "Some trust in chariots, and some in horses but we will remember the name of the Lord our God" (Psalm 20: 7).

REIGNING IN LIFE

Romans 5:17 "For if by one man's offence death reigned by one; much more they which receive abundance of grace and of the gift of righteousness shall reign in life by one, Jesus Christ."

IT would take a lifetime—nay, it will demand eternity—to explore the treasures of this paragraph from which our text is taken. Let us not, however, stand gazing into heaven, but avail ourselves of the privilege offered us during our earthly life of reigning through the One, even Jesus Christ. Do not postpone the fulfilment of this promise! We may have to wait for the future life to unfold depths of meaning which now transcend our thought; but any fair reading of this radiant verse compels us to appropriate it for here and now.

But, "how can these things be?" Ah, a master in Israel asked that question of Christ! This blessed life of victory is only possible to those who have been born from above. By nature we were born from below into the first Adam, who was "a living soul." We must be born from above, into the second Adam, who becomes to all who trust in Him a Life-giving spirit (1 Co 15:45). That which is born of the flesh is flesh, and cannot of itself rise into the Spirit; the Holy Spirit must stoop to lift it into union with Himself. But He will do this for you, if only you will lift your heart to Christ in simple faith and surrender.

The difference it will make! Each life has been planned by God with the intention of training it for high service here and beyond; and whatever happens in life, there is always an abundance of grace awaiting our use. But how often we are as blind to it as Balaam was to the Angel that stood on the wayside! We make our plans! We lie awake half the night in a fever of anxiety! We go to this friend or that! But we do not claim that abundance of grace which is intended to meet the need of the hour. It is only as we receive it by a childlike faith that we can reign in life. That word "abundance" in its Latin original speaks of ocean-waves. Stand on the shore and look out on that infinite expanse, and do not be content with scooping up enough to fill an oyster-shell!

What will result? A royal life! If a throne means power—we are strengthened with might by His Spirit in the inner man. If it means victory—we are more than conquerors through Him that loved us. If it means largess—we have always all sufficiency in all things, and abound to every good work.

PRAYER-Heavenly Father, I thank Thee for the trials and pains that are ever working for my good, and making me a partaker of Thy holiness. May I receive the abundance of Thy grace, and reign in life here and hereafter. AMEN.
