LORD’S DAY 13 JANUARY 2008

GODLY RESOLUTIONS FOR THE NEW YEAR

It is edifying to have God-honouring goals in life as we begin the new year by the enabling strength of the Lord.

Here is an example of the resolutions of Michael Roberts who covenanted with God in 1803.

1. I resolve, by the grace of God, that I will search the Bible as my life's chief study, and that I will read some portion of it every day, and take every advantage of the works of authors within my reach with the aim of increasing my knowledge in God's Word.
2. I resolve, by the grace of God, to sanctify the Sabbath, in thought, word and deed.
3. I resolve that my behaviour and my communion with my brethren and my non-professing fellow-sinners shall be such as is consistent with the Gospel, and without affliction to myself, and edifying and profitable to them.
4. I resolve, by the grace of God, that I shall not rush into anything, or change my situation in life, or remove any livelihood, or anything of that sort, without enquiring much of the Bible, and seeking advice from my parents and brethren.
5. I resolve, by the grace of God, that I shall not be a slanderer, or a flatterer, or double-tongued, or tell any untruth; but that I shall endeavour to be pure from the blood of all men in the great Judgement.
6. I resolve, by the grace of God, while I minister in the Church, to concentrate on the true doctrine and discipline; and that I shall not be jealous at the elevation of any of my brethren, but rather shall labour to fill my position for God, rightly using my talents in the light of the day of account.
7. I resolve, by the grace of God, to observe carefully God's Providence, in respect of the Kingdom, the Church, and Families, and especially in respect of myself.
8. I resolve, by the grace of God, that I shall not misuse any of my precious time, but rather shall spend it in the manner in which I should have...

desired to spend it when giving my detailed account [to God].

9. I resolve, by the grace of God, to be faithful and honest in my calling, and to keep a conscience void of offence toward God and men.
10. I resolve, by the grace of God, that I shall not be miserly, or wasteful, concerning the mercies of this life, but shall eat and dress as is seemly; and shall contribute to the cause of the Gospel, and be charitable, as God has prospered me.
11. I resolve, by the grace of God, never to eat or drink or sleep to excess, not to do any injury to my nature in any way, as far as I am aware.
12. I resolve, by the grace of God, to do those things concerning which there is no specific commandment in the Bible in accordance with the general commandments.

Church Covenant

Here is an example of a Church Covenant agreed upon by the Congregational Society of non-conformist protestants in Llanbrynmair (i.e. Wales in the UK).

As a Church of the living God, and members of the Lord Jesus Christ, and by the help of the Holy Spirit, we bind ourselves and make a covenant with the Lord, and with one another in the following matters:

1. Regarding the points of our faith we assert the doctrines contained in the Shorter Catechism of the Westminster Assembly (1643-47) in accordance with the word of God.
2. We promise to strive against every sin and all occasions that appear likely to lead us into sin.
3. We promise to practice with constant diligence all the means, public and private, that God has commanded, namely, to pray, to meditate, to read, to listen to the word and to partake of communion, so as to build up ourselves and on another in grace and holiness.
4. We promise to strive conscientiously to uphold and to exercise such discipline in the House of God as is in accordance with His holy word.
5. We promise that if we do anything deserving of rebuke in the opinion of the Church, to submit to such rebuke as appears meet to the Church.
6. We promise to consult the Church when contemplating taking any important step, especially marriage; and we agree that it is the bounden duty of every church member not to carry on a friendship with any person with a view to marriage, without first of all consulting the Church, and the neglect of this duty in itself deserves rebuke.
7. We promise that we shall not harbour evil thoughts concerning one another without conscientiously ascertaining if we have just cause, and that we shall not believe every tale we hear about one another without sufficient...

testimony, and especially that we shall not slander one another, but rather that we shall conceal one another's faults in so far as we are able to do so with a good conscience.

8. We promise according to our gifts and opportunities, to do our utmost to build up one another in the Lord, that is, to pray and keep watch over one another, to be ready to give the best advice and guidance that we can to one another, and to behave kindly and forgivingly to one another according to the law of Christ.
9. Whatsoever be our family circumstances to at anytime may be, we promise to strive to fulfil every duty appertaining to our family life in a conscientious manner according to the word of God.
10. We promise that we shall contribute conscientiously and faithfully, according to our circumstances, towards the sustenance of the cause of the Lord in our midst.
11. We promise to do as much good as we can to every man in every station, and, through sober, honest, just, helpful and meek conversation, do our utmost to win others to the faith.

Since we devoutly hope, that God has called us by his grace, we feel an obligation to devote ourselves, in a public manner, to God, and his service; and as we prefer to be embodied into a Church, rather than to unite with any other Church, we hope that ministers and Churches will recognise us as such.

We now, in the most deliberate, and public manner, dedicate ourselves to God in church fellowship and communion, according to the rule of his revealed word. We are also determined, and we vow, that by divine aid, we will be steadfast in the faith, 'walk in all the commandments and ordinances of the Lord', hear His word, trust in His promises, and serve Him and each other according to the laws and institutions of His house.

Our purpose and aim in all this are, the glory of God, and our own edification, the increase of the kingdom of Christ, and the good of all mankind; and we earnestly pray that our dependence may be placed on the direction and aid of the Spirit of God.
