OUR IDENTITY IN CHRIST

A Study in Ephesians 1:1-6

Introduction

Many Christians have an identity crisis. They have been so imprinted by the world that they do not know who they really are in Christ. They see themselves as “turkeys” trapped in a chaotic coop bound for the slaughter house, when they should be flying like eagles (Isaiah 40:31--*But they who wait on the Lord shall renew their strength; They shall mount up with wings as eagles, they shall run, and not be weary; and they shall walk, and not faint.*) In Ephesians, the Apostle Paul dwells on our true identity in Christ, to get us out of the turkey coop and help us fly like eagles. From the first six verses, we glean four great truths that summarize our identification with Christ.

I. We Are All Saints (vv. 1-2)

Paul distinguishes himself as “an apostle” (Greek: *sent with a commission*). His apostleship was by the will of God, reminding us that the church is built on the foundation of the apostles and prophets (Ephesians 2:20). Paul is writing to “the saints which are at Ephesus.” What are saints? Simply stated, saints are people whose lives have been changed by Jesus Christ. The word “saint” literally means “holy” and has the thought of being “set apart.” When you were saved, God set you apart for his service and declared you holy because of the sacrifice of Jesus on your behalf. It is interesting that once a person is saved, the Bible no longer calls him a sinner, but always a saint. Paul also says that saints are “faithful.” True believers are faithful because we are truly saved. As Christians, we are “in Christ” reminding us that we are citizens of heaven with Christ as our king. To aid us in our identity in Christ, we have always at our disposal God’s “grace” (undeserved goodness in our lives), and “peace” (true peace comes when our sins are forgiven and we can have true peace with God).

II. We Are All Blessed (v. 3)

It is fitting that Paul begins a list of our blessings by a hymn of praise to God the Father. All of our blessings come from Him, and thus we must remember that we should always bless His Holy Name (Matthew 19:17). We are blessed because God always meets our needs. Psalm 37:25 says: “Yet have I not seen the righteous forsaken, nor his seed begging bread.” We are promised every spiritual blessing in Ephesians, which are the wonderful gifts that are ours right now! We ask for love and peace and joy, but these are things we are already promised (see Romans 5:5; John 14:27, and John 15:11). Cling to the fact that right now we have the power from God to live a life of godliness, and that we are imprinted with an identity in Christ.. Ephesians 2:6 amplifies the thought of the words “in heavenly places in Christ” by saying that we are already⁶ raised up and sitting in the heavenly places in Christ Jesus—we are already fit for heaven, and are just now foreigners in a foreign land.

III. We Are All Chosen (v. 4)

God specifically chose us in Christ to be saved. This is a great comfort, yet many teach that man must choose God to be saved. Jesus did command people to repent and trust the Lord, and this was reechoed by Paul. Yet, the Bible clearly teaches that God chooses us first. Jesus said in John 6:44: *No man can come to me, except the Father which hath sent Me draw him.*” God chose us first, and Jesus died for our sins while we were still sinners. God’s people today, the body of Christ, are elect, chosen by God. 2 Timothy 1:9 says that God has saved us and called us with a holy calling, not according to our works, but according to his own purpose and grace which was given to us in Christ Jesus before time began. Paul thanked the Lord for electing us to salvation through the sanctification by the Holy Spirit and our belief in the truth. What type of holy people we should be in light of this?

IV. We Are All Adopted (vv. 5-6)

In love, God adopted us and predestined us as sons. It was the ultimate act of love that God, from the “foundation of the world” looked down through time and chose us to be his own special people. In love, He determined to adopt us into his forever family and invites us now to call him *Abba*, an affectionate term for Father (Ephesians 2:4-5). When God adopted us according to His predetermined plan, He gave us not only spiritual blessings, but His own nature as well. All this was done according to the good pleasure of His will (Eph. 1:5). We have an identity with Christ, and we are adopted to live a life pleasing to God. Is your life pleasing to God?
