WHAT IS THE TRUTH? (2 JOHN 1-4)

The recipient of the second letter of John is enigmatic. She was addressed as the “elect lady and her children.” Bible commentators have different views concerning who the elect lady is. Some believe that she is a figurative way of designating a particular church. Others hold that the letter was addressed to an individual Christian and her family. Personally I take the second view because the principle of Biblical interpretation says that the literal should take precedence over other methods of interpretation. I do not see that there is a conflict in interpretation when I take the “elect lady” as an individual believer. The Apostle wrote to a sister in Christ and her biological children.

The Apostle John tells us a few things about this “elect lady and her children” in the first four verses of the letter:

1. The “elect lady and her children” are well-loved (v. 1)

“The elder unto the elect lady and her children, whom I love in the truth; and not I only, but also all they that have known the truth.”

The Apostle John and the Ephesian Christians loved this family. (I believe the three Epistles of John were written in Ephesus) Why is this family well-loved by the Christian community? I believe it must be something that has to do with the truth. In verse 1 “truth” is mentioned twice; in fact it is mentioned 5 times in the first four verses of the letter.

There is a particular emphasis in the last phrase of verse 1, “but also all they that have known the truth.” John wants us to know that the elect lady, her children and all the believers, even he have one thing in common, and that is, they have the truth.

2. The “elect lady and her children” are walking in the truth (v. 4)

“I rejoiced greatly that I found of thy children walking in truth, as we have received a commandment from the Father.”

Here the Apostle John gives his reason for loving the elect lady and her children. Though it was not specifically mentioned, it must be true that John and the believers found joy in knowing that the elect lady is also walking in the truth. The fact that her children are walking in truth is a testament of the lady’s good influence and teaching to her children.

Solomon says, “Train up a child in the way he should go: and when he is old, he will not depart from it.” (Proverbs 22:6) This is what the elect lady did for her children. I am sure Rev Ki will have great delight in seeing you and your children walking in the truth.

What is the Truth?

Pilate asked Jesus this question when the later was brought to him for judgment (John 18:38). What led him to this question, "What is truth?" In the earlier verse Pilate asked Jesus, "Art thou a king?" Jesus replied: "Thou sayest that I am a king. To this end was I born, and for this cause came I into the world, that I should bear witness unto the truth. Every one that is of the truth heareth my voice." Jesus affirmed the things Pilate heard about Him.

A. Jesus is the Truth

The Apostle John emphasised on this doctrine more than the other writers of the Bible. He wanted to counteract the false teaching of Gnosticism which was prevailing in his day. The Gnostics do not believe in the incarnation and resurrection of the dead. John proved Jesus is the Truth - He was "made in the likeness of men" (Philippines 2:7) and He "died for our sins and he was buried and he rose again the day according to the Scriptures." (1 Corinthians 15:3-4)

Here are some verses on Jesus the Truth:

John 1:14 "And the Word was made flesh, and dwelt among us, (and we beheld his glory, the glory as of the only begotten of the Father,) full of grace and truth."
John 14:6 "Jesus saith unto him, I am the way, the truth, and the life: no man cometh unto the Father but by me."

And in John 18:38 Pilate asked "What is truth?" Jesus replied that He is the Truth.

B. The Word is Truth

John 17 is commonly known as the high-priestly prayer of the Lord Jesus Christ. He prays for the sanctification of the believers saying, "Sanctify them through thy truth: thy word is truth."(v. 17) God's Word is the Truth.

The Bible is infallible and inerrant because it is God's Truth. We adhere to the teaching of the Bible because it is God's Word and it is the Truth. In Psalm 19:7-9 is a six-fold description of God's special revelation. Verse 7 says "the law of the LORD is perfect" and the word "perfect" in the original language may also be translated as Truth. Verse 9 says "the judgments of the LORD are true and righteous altogether;" the judgments of the LORD is another way of describing God's revelation and the psalmist says they are true and righteous altogether.

Conclusion:

We are commanded to preach the truth. The idea is we preach Christ and the Word of God. We are also commanded to defend the truth. The implication is we defend the doctrine of Christ and the Word of God. Do you believe in the truth?
