MAKING WISE CHOICES

Life is filled with many choices, choices that affect us on an everyday basis in everything we do. That means our everyday choices are not without significance. Our choices affect us and others in dramatic ways whether we see it immediately or not.

Making choices in many occasions is not an easy matter. We fear to make a wrong choice. A wrong choice may bring sorrow and pain. The effect is felt by the person who made the choice and sometimes also by others who are closed or related to him.

However we must not be intimidated from making choices, for even a failure to make choices is a choice itself. Dr William James (a pioneering American psychologist and philosopher) says, "When you have to make a choice and don't make it, that is in itself a choice."

We should be making choices conscientiously. The best guide to making choices is to know what God's word says about it. For this reason, every Christian ought to be a diligent student of the Word. "Study to shew thyself approved unto God, a workman that needeth not to be ashamed, rightly dividing the word of truth." (2 Timothy 2 : 15).

A. We need to make wise choices.

In Ephesians 5 : 15 – 18 Paul teaches the necessity of making wise choices. He gives the reasons for many wise choices as:

1. We need to make wise choice because it spares us from making mistakes and thereby suffer the consequence of the mistakes.

Ephesians 5 : 15 "See then that ye walk circumspectly, not as fools, but as wise."

The Bible says that a wise man sees danger and he will avoid, but a fool heads straight into it. The foolish man builds his house on the sand. This man will suffer the consequence of his imprudent choice. When the rain and the flood come, the house built on the sand will collapse.

We have read in the newspaper on many occasions that a drunkard regrets for the rest of his life for killing a pedestrian through drink driving. The driver has made an irresponsible choice and his action will affect others and also himself for a long time.

2. We need to make wise choices because it saves time.

Ephesians 5 : 16 "Redeeming the time, because the days are evil."

We are living in the end time. Paul calls the last days as perilous time. Satan and the world want to pull the Christians away from God. Many times they do it by the wrong decision we made.

A pastor took 15 years to realize that he was wrong to leave the service of the Lord. He was doing business rather than being the business of God. It was a choice he made 15 years ago that he is regretting now.

3. We need to make wise choices because it is God's will

Ephesians 5 : 17 - 18 "Wherefore be ye not unwise, but understanding what the will of the Lord is. And be not drunk with wine, wherein is excess; but be filled with the Spirit." (verses 17 and 18)

The word "excess" comes from the Greek *asōtia* meaning profligacy or prodigality. In the parable of the prodigal son, the younger son took his share of the inheritance and went to live a wanton life. Soon he was in abject poverty and he returned to his father's house.

The prodigal son made an imprudent choice and was clearly out of the will of God. The will of God is we make wise choices. A wise choice will honour God and benefit others whom we are closed or related to.

Wisdom comes from the fear of the Lord. May we always be asking God to enable us to be prudent in our choices? (James 1 : 5)

Eleanor Roosevelt (wife of American President Franklin D. Roosevelt) has these words to say about making choices: "One's philosophy is not best expressed in words. It is expressed in the choices one makes. In the long run, we shape our lives and we shape ourselves. The process never ends until we die. And the choices we make are ultimately our responsibility."

SHORTER CATECHISM QUESTION 48
