My Dear Reader,

WHEN SHADOWS DARKEN

October 6, 2013 - The sky outside was bright and sunny on Thursday morning but the light gave way to a darkened overcast with a foreboding aura of a storm about to pounce Cambridge. Have you experienced something like that in your life recently?

The Psalmist, in Psalm 88, related his difficulties with the stormy times he was facing. He spoke of crying day and night before the LORD, hoping that his prayers would be heard. Why? Because, his life was filled with problems and life threatening issues. He felt as one who was in a deep pit with no means of help. In the deep darkness, he could not see anything, let alone find any rope to rescue him from his destruction. In the blackness of the dark night, he could think, but his thoughts only seemed to turn to all the problems of his life. He was aware of approaching death, like rising flood waters with no means of escape. We have no real idea of exactly what he was facing. Was it physical illness, a broken relationship, lost employment, terroristic threats, an incurable disease, the loss of a loved one, or...? Likely it was a combination of things that were coming upon him.

According to the psalm title, the author is Heman, an Ezrahite, noted as a very wise and capable man under Solomon (1 Kings 4:31). Was he teaching abstractly through what he wrote, or was he teaching from life experience? I think he is teaching through the real lessons of his own life. Though he was an experienced musician and teacher, he too faced deep and threatening times. But note that he continued to cry out to the LORD, even in the end when he was so aware of his aloneness far away from his support network or lover and friend.

In the New Testament we meet a woman who was surrounded by darkness and death, unable to sort out what was happening in her world. Her cherished friend had died in a most brutal way. She had ventured out in the darkness to honor him by caring for his corpse. Though at the right grave site, she could not find his body, it was gone. Consumed by the shadows, loss, and darkness, she wept. Then someone spoke to her, *Why are you weeping?* Thinking he was the maintenance man, still consumed with her hurts, she asked him where he had taken the body. Wait, that was a voice she recognized. Yes, in her darkness Jesus had been standing right there with her but she was unaware of him (John 20:14-16). He patiently waited for her to recognize Him. Are you surrounded by darkness – now? Are you aware that Jesus is present with you?

As a congregation, we have been blessed with the ministry of Pastor and Mrs. Colin Wong for three months, standing in for the Pastor and Mrs. Timothy Ki. But, we are aware that they were here because Pastor Ki needed immediate medical attention in Adelaide. There have been afflictions and disappointments in these months, but God has proven faithful again and again. Think of the Wongs situation with his illness the week before their coming, only to encounter difficulties with the UK Borders Agency, God intervened. We have worshiped together, prayed together, worked together, celebrated birthdays, welcomed visitors, and strengthened relationships with one another. Are there challenges ahead? Absolutely, but the same God who met Mary accompanies us in all we face. He has promised to never leave us nor forsake us (Hebrews 13:5).

SHORTER CATECHISM QUESTION 91

Q: What is a sacrament?

A: A Sacrament is an holy ordinance instituted by **CHRIST**, wherein, – by sensible signs – Christ, and the benefits of the New Covenant, are represented, sealed, and applied to believers.

Comments:

We are here taught that the marks of a sacrament are: 1. That it is appointed by Christ; 2. That it is a way of teaching the gospel by *outward signs*. Its uses are three in number: 1. To *represent* the gospel to us, or teach it plainly; 2. To *seal* the gospel to us, or confirm our faith in it; 3. To *apply* the gospel to us, or bring it home to our hearts. The word *sacrament* is derived from a Latin word, which signified the sacred oath of fidelity to his commander, which the soldier took on entering the army for the service of his country. In a Christian sense, it means the vow of fidelity and obedience to Christ which is taken when we enter the Church. This vow was taken for us in Baptism, when we were infants. In the Lord's Supper, we take it upon ourselves.
