WHEN TEMPTATIONS ROUND YOU GATHER

13/10/2013 In the Sept. 16, 2013 *New York Times* an article notes the results of the surprising discoveries about addiction and use of crack cocaine. Dr. Carl Hart of Columbia University, New York experimented with crack cocaine addicts. The participants were recruited with an offer: Smoke crack cocaine and make up to \$950.00! Participants had to stay in a hospital for the experimental period to be monitored. Choices were offered to them daily. They could smoke crack or earn a \$5.00 voucher for store purchases or a \$5.00 cash reward, either was payable at the end of their program. When they were given a larger dosage of the drug, they typically rejected the money and chose the drug. When they received a lower quantity of the drug, they chose the cash offer, over the drug. To the researchers' surprise, when the addict perceived that the reward as more valuable, they chose it over the drugs. Dr. D. Nutt, a professor of neuropsychopharmacology at Imperial College London commented, "Addiction always has a social element, and this is magnified in societies with little in the way of work or other ways to find fulfillment."

Michael Graham, writing in response to the article, noted: "Sin is simultaneously rational and irrational. Sin typically has a "payoff" associated with it—whether the release of neurochemicals to the brain for some illicit or risky behavior, or the temporary and fleeting gratification of revenge, greed, lust, or hatred. It makes sense, then, that if one's joy in Christ is minimal, then the payoff of sin would seem more attractive. But the payoff of sin over-promises and under-delivers. Sin is deceptive—it promises one thing and gives you something else. Sin is always irrational because the payoff is always a lie. Sin promises you the true/good/beautiful and gives you gravel in your mouth instead. Therefore, **when our joy and pleasure in Christ is superior to the payoff of sin, we choose Christ over the sin and its payoff**" (emphasis added).

Last Saturday, in our weekly prayer meeting, we took time to look at Job and the temptations that he endured. From Job 1, we noted that God knows exactly who we are and where we are, all the time. At the same time, Satan knows who we are and what we are doing also. We noted that when we "give in" to a temptation, we reveal that the temptation has something in reserve over us. There is something that attracts us, and takes the priority over our satisfaction in our Lord Jesus Christ. As the late Leon Morris taught, Jesus faced every temptation just as we do, but He did not give in to the temptation because it had nothing in reserve over Him (Hebrews 4:14-16). That is why we can go to Him boldly, at His invitation, and with confidence to find help in our time of need. As a Christian, you are never in a hopeless context like the one Dr. Nutt described above. We are great sinners, but we have a great Savior, Jesus our righteous high priest! Each time we find our pleasure in Christ of greater riches than those of sin for the moment, we gain in strength and go forward in the power of the Holy Spirit to greater usefulness for our Lord (Luke 4:13).

In the hymn ***Take the Name of Jesus with You***, Lydia Odell Baxter helps us refocus:

Take the name of Jesus with you,
child of sorrow and of woe,
It will joy and comfort give you,
take it then where'ere you go.
Take the name of Jesus ever,
as a shield from every snare,
When temptations round you gather,
breathe that holy name in prayer.

SHORTER CATECHISM QUESTION 92

Q: How do the sacraments become effectual means of salvation?

*A: The sacraments become effectual means of salvation - not from any virtue in them, or in him that doth administer them - but only by the **blessing of Christ**, and the **working of his Spirit** in them that by faith receive them.*

Comments:

We are here taught the proper way of using the sacraments. We must pray for the blessing of Christ on them. It was he who appointed them and it is he alone who can make them of benefit to our souls. In themselves the sacraments are of no value, nor can the minister (notwithstanding what the Roman Catholic Church says) give them any power whatever apart from Christ.
