ETERNAL REFUGE IN A STORM

(Isaiah 25:1-12)

Introduction

Life on earth has many trials and tribulations and we need a reliable anchor and refuge in times of great testings or distress. Consider these 4 aspects below where God can be our eternal Strength and Refuge.

Acknowledge Christ as our Lord and God and Ascribe to Him glory, repenting of our sins (v.1)

Our God Jehovah is a holy, just, almighty personal and compassionate God who cares for His elect. We cannot have a strong refuge unless we have a personal relationship with Christ. When we ask our earthly father for help, we can be certain he will definitely help us. How much more our Father in Heaven. Do you know God personally? Have you acknowledged your depravity and believed and accepted Jesus in your life? Isaiah in Isaiah 6 confessed his sins with consecration to serve God wholeheartedly.

One of the evidences that you are saved is this: what would you think of or do with or for God? Despite hard times, Isaiah determined to praise God's name because God has done wonderful things. Do you remember what God has done for us at the cross while we were still fallen sinners? We should remember the day that God redeemed us by His saving grace with a life-changing transformation which gave us power and victory over sin.

The word "Exalt" means uplift. "Praise" means to acknowledge the worth of someone. We should resolve to magnify His name (Psalm 145:1-3), and determine never to miss worshipping God on the Sabbath and seeking Him in the prayer meeting. In your hectic schedule, do you make time for God daily? If you know God intimately, you will be filled with great reverence and you would want to glorify and praise Him. Keep a diary of these spiritual thoughts and do not be afraid to witness and tell others what God has done for you (Mark 5:19).

Accept the everlasting counsel of God given in His word which is faithful and true (v.1)

In the bible, the word "counsel" is used in three ways: first, used in proverbs as a synonym to the Word of God; second, to refer to "advice"; and third, to refer to "direction". Here it refers to both advice and direction. Today, we tend to seek advice from different people but not all of them are sound. God's counsel is always faithful and true. Are you open to seek the counsel of God in your decisions of life or do you just do things that you want wilfully? (Proverbs 19:20).

King David always sought God's counsel when he was in need. In the times of the Old Testament Aaron, a High Priest would always carry two stones, the Urim and Thummim, that He used to seek God's counsel with much prayer (Exodus 28:30). Hebrews 6:18 speaks of the unchanging nature of God's counsel. Contrast this to man's changing and often deficient if not defective worldly counsel. Best of all, God's counsel is absolutely true and free though unfortunately many today do not take His counsel seriously. How do we deal with problems of the day? How should we guide our children in their studies or our employees? We need to humbly seek and honour God first diligently and then seek His will and study to obey His word as well (Proverbs 3:5).

Abide in Christ as the source of refuge and strength in times of life's troubles (v.2-4)

Have you been needy or distressed before? Have you ever felt helpless in a situation? The concept of refuge is a safe hiding place in times of great troubles. In 1906 in the United States, a devastating storm swept through the city of Galveston, Texas. Many perished but some who hid inside a lighthouse were unharmed. God is the safe Lighthouse or the eternal and solid Rock (1 Corinthians 10:4) or the cave that we can hide in. During the tsunami of 26 December 2004, a group of Indonesian Christians were having their Christmas service in the mountains near Sumatra as they were driven away by their hostile neighbours and that higher ground ironically became a strong refuge in the midst of the fatal tidal wave where about 230,000 died.

Psalm 46 is the favourite psalm of the German Protestant Reformer, Martin Luther. He was once summoned to the Diet (a meeting) of Worms in 1521 to meet Charles V, the Roman emperor and a host of prelates to answer false charges. He thought he might never come back alive but he faced his travail with great courage, and famously gave the unforgettable quote: "I cannot and will not recant anything, for to go against conscience is neither right nor safe. Here I stand, I can do no other, so help me God. Amen." The Emperor finally let him go and gave the decree he could not be harmed in the next 21 days. Later the Elector Frederick of Saxony had him kidnapped and kept him for 10 months under protection in Wartburg castle, and there he wrote the blessed hymn, 'A Mighty Fortress is our God' and translated the New Testament into German in 1522.

Assent or agree to the power of Christ over sin and death as our only hope (v.6-12)

Will you come to the spiritual feast of life and partake of the pure gospel of Christ? Matthew 11:28-30 says, *'Come unto me, all ye that labour and are heavy laden, and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you, and learn of me; for I am meek and lowly in heart: and ye shall find rest unto your souls. For my yoke is easy, and my burden is light.'* Imagine the abundance and richness of the wonderful spiritual feast that is offered by Christ. There is so much we can receive from Christ if only we depart from sin and accept the glorious invitation to trust in Him fully and hope in the victorious risen Christ and experience abundant and everlasting life. John 10:10 says, *'The thief cometh not, but for to steal, and to kill, and to destroy: I am come that they might have life, and that they might have it more abundantly.'* Jesus is the only true Saviour of the world and we can rejoice in His everlasting salvation if He is truly our God and our Lord!

Conclusion

Psalm 139:23-24 says, *'Search me, O God, and know my heart: try me, and know my thoughts: And see if there be any wicked way in me, and lead me in the way everlasting.'*

We need to reflect soberly and prayerfully forsake self and all and repent of all our sins and believe and acknowledge Jesus Christ today as our personal Saviour and Lord. Follow Him fully and take up your cross and call on Him for mercy and grace and read and obey His word (Romans 10:9-10) and God will be our eternal Refuge and Fortress in times of many troubles.
