OUR HELPER IN PRAYER

Scripture Text: Romans 8:1-26-27

Dear Brethren in the Lord,

Introduction

The title of this short devotion is "Our Helper in Prayer". We will look at verse 26 and 27 of the passage in particular. Verse 26 says, *"Likewise the Spirit also helpeth our infirmities: for we know not what we should pray for as we ought: but the Spirit itself maketh intercession for us with groanings which cannot be uttered. Verse 27 "And he that searcheth the hearts knoweth what is the mind of the Spirit, because he maketh intercession for the saints according to the will of God."*

This is often times the state of our prayer life, *"we know not what we should pray for as we ought"*. Believers are so feeble in our praying, so superficial in our praying and we lack that true spirit of praying which is typical of saints in the past when they cried out to God. Our problems often times may due to our infirmities or due to the presence of sins in our life. But God has given us help through His Holy Spirit and this is the first part we want to look at.

1. The Holy Spirit Helps Us

We as believers have this help of the Holy Spirit promised to us which we do not avail ourselves to. The verse says, *"Likewise the Spirit also helpeth our infirmities: for we know not what we should pray for as we ought."* God knows that often times we have either great difficulties in praying or we are praying for the wrong things and frequently we do not pray enough and do not feel like praying. God knows that, therefore Paul is saying that the Holy Spirit is the greatest and most divine help for Christians who have such problems mentioned earlier.

The help is there waiting for us to call upon especially in our moment of darkness, confusion, ignorant and weaknesses. When we have no strength and our inner spirit seems to have gone out of us, then the Spirit of God gives wisdom to our ignorance and changes our weakness into strength. This is what the Holy Spirit will do for us and desire to do in us. He gives us the word to pray, inspires us to pray and upholds our spirit in prayer.

Furthermore, the Spirit brings to remembrance what the Lord had done for us on Calvary and gives us boldness to come before the throne of grace. Brethren, we have divine help in our praying.

Next, the Spirit not only enables us, but also assist us to pray according the will of God. 1 John 5:14-15 *"And this is the confidence that we have in him, that, if we ask any thing according to his will, he heareth us: And if we know that he hear us, whatsoever we ask, we know that we have the petitions that we desired of him."*

This praying "according to His will" does not mean submission, but rather conformity and the words, "According to" means after the standard, conformity and in agreement. Thus we can be encouraged that whatever our infirmities, we have help and given the boldness to come with great freedom before the mercy seat. We moved on to the second part of verse 26.

2. The Holy Spirit Makes Intercession For Us

This is indeed the next thing the Holy Spirit is doing as we can see clearly from this verse. It says *“but the Spirit itself maketh intercession for us with groanings which cannot be uttered.”* and the first part of verse 27 continues to tell us that, *“And he that searcheth the hearts knoweth what is the mind of the Spirit, because he maketh intercession for the saints according to the will of God.”*

When we compare these verses with that of 1 Corinthians 2:9-16 we will see one very important element about the Spirit interceding on our behalf, *“But as it is written, Eye hath not seen, nor ear heard, neither have entered into the heart of man, the things which God hath prepared for them that love him. But God hath revealed them unto us by his Spirit: for the Spirit searcheth all things, yea, the deep things of God. For what man knoweth the things of a man, save the spirit of man which is in him? even so the things of God knoweth no man, but the Spirit of God. Now we have received, not the spirit of the world, but the spirit which is of God; that we might know the things that are freely given to us of God. Which things also we speak, not in the words which man's wisdom teacheth, but which the Holy Ghost teacheth; comparing spiritual things with spiritual. But the natural man receiveth not the things of the Spirit of God: for they are foolishness unto him: neither can he know them, because they are spiritually discerned. But he that is spiritual judgeth all things, yet he himself is judged of no man. For who hath known the mind of the Lord, that he may instruct him? But we have the mind of Christ.”*

The key note in 1 Cor. 2 is *“revealed unto us by the Spirit”*. Revealed what to us? Verses 10-12 answer, *“for the Spirit searcheth all things, yea, the deep things of God. For what man knoweth the things of a man, save the spirit of man which is in him? even so the things of God knoweth no man, but the Spirit of God. Now we have received, not the spirit of the world, but the spirit which is of God; that we might know the things that are freely given to us of God.”*

In other words, the Spirit reveals to us the mind of God so that *“we might know the things that are freely given to us of God.”* That is how we must pray according to His will and that is how we know what to ask for and then secure what we ask for.

You and me as sinful people naturally will pray according to our own will and fancy. Our groaning in prayer is most often out of selfishness and self-will and not that of the Spirit. That is why the Spirit intercedes for us and with us and reveals to us the mind of God so that we will pray according to the will of God. Only then can we pray as we ought in tune or in steps to His thoughts, His purposes and His desires.

So we have in verse 27, that *“the Spirit itself maketh intercession for us with groanings which cannot be uttered.”* We need not be down and out and go under the burden of afflictions because the Holy Spirit as it were, bears us up and carry our burden so that we faint not. The Spirit groans along with creation and the believers refers to the Spirit's work of sustaining us, supports us in those deep emotions, those intense feelings, those inward sighs, which cannot be expressed in language, but which the Spirit can enables us to bear, and which are understood by Him that searcheth the hearts.”

Besides this, we have already discovered that the Spirit incites us to pray and tell us from within our hearts what we ought to pray and how to pray. The prayer of a true believer cannot be frustrated because it proceeds from the Spirit of God who dwells in us. Amen.
