Church Theme 2014 – “Waiting for God” – Isaiah 30:18

SEALED BY BELIEVING

“In whom ye also *trusted*, after that ye heard the word of truth, the gospel of your salvation: in whom also after that ye believed, ye were sealed with that holy Spirit of promise.” Ephesians 1:13

Today, we come to a text for the believer’s assurance of faith. If you battle with doubts and fears about your salvation here is the evidence you need to doubt no more and go on your way rejoicing.

The moment you believe on the Lord Jesus you are sealed with the Holy Spirit. Sealed means to be stamped, approved, or ratified as a genuine Christian. You are marked as a child of God. The stamp of approval is the indwelling of the Holy Spirit, who gives an immediate witness within the believer’s soul that he is born of God and given a new nature. Salvation is God coming into the soul of man. Salvation means you are never alone, but indwelt at all times by the Holy Spirit - the third person of the Trinity. By the fall, sinful man is separated from God and driven out of God’s presence - as happened to Adam and eve in the garden. Through salvation God comes into the soul. God gives spiritual life to dead hearts and there is a resurrection in our souls. Such is the thorough renovation of our nature that you can’t be saved and not know it, and you can’t be saved and not show it.

The apostle Paul went on to expound this indwelling of the Spirit in the heart of the believer “as the earnest of our inheritance until the redemption of the purchased possession” (v.14). The term “earnest” is the security deposit for the purchase of our souls. It is the first instalment to secure us and mark us for heaven. We are not taken home yet. The owner has to return to pick up the possession, but until the final transfer of the purchase the Holy Spirit dwells in us.

Perhaps you have gone to a store and asked the shop assistant to hold an item for you. Maybe it’s a new item of furniture that’s on sale. It might be a couch you have wanted for a long time and you don’t want to miss the opportunity of the right couch at the right price at the right time. But you can’t transport it home the same day. So, you put a security deposit on it and the staff lays the item aside with your name on it, along with a sold-sticker. No one else can claim that item. The store staff expect you to return and make full transaction take full possession of the couch on the day and time you arrange to pick it up.

That's like the earnest of our inheritance in the gospel. The security deposit is the indwelling of the Holy Spirit and from the moment the Lord's name is on us. We are Christians, we bear Christ's name. This is our state while we remain in this world, and one day the Lord will take us home as his fully purchased possession, "to the praise of his glory."

This first instalment of our salvation is mind boggling. I'm a Christian in waiting. I'm not yet what I'm going to be. I only have the first instalment of the gospel, and yet the joy I feel, the song I have and the access I have to God in prayer fills my heart with hope for the future state I shall enjoy God's presence. I'm only at the starting line of the race of faith. Not till I'm in heaven will I know the fullness of glory.

But, praise God, we have heaven begun already, right now through the personal ministry of the Holy Spirit in our hearts heaven has begun in us. This, Paul says, "is the gospel of your salvation." It is the good news of the gospel. And brother or sister, we have only received a little drop out of the ocean of God's eternal blessings! The end is not yet, and the best is yet to be. For the born again Christian the future is as bright as the promises of God, for our God isn't done with us yet. Praise be to His Name!
