CALL TO ALL

Introduction:

The Church is a community chosen and called by God to witness, testify and proclaim the gospel to the world until the second coming of Lord Jesus Christ. The word "**Church**", which comes from Greek word "*Ecclesia*", is from two words – 'ek' (out) and 'kaleo' (called). In other words, a Church is a body of Christians "**called out**" of the world to come together into a separate Called and Commissioned Community. The Church has High Calling of being a Witness to the whole world. As Christians we are called to walk worthy of our calling in this world. Thus, I call your attention to the Great Commission (Matthew 28:18-20) to ponder over again and remind ourselves of our negligence of duty in being Disciples of Christ. The Great Commission is a most significant passage in the Holy Scriptures. It was the last recorded personal instruction given by Lord Jesus Christ to His disciples. It is also a special calling from the Lord Jesus Christ to all His followers to take specific action while on this earth. The Great Commission is the beginning of faith in action for all Christians. There are four major aspects in these verses:

1. All Power – Authority (18b): "...All power is given unto me in heaven and in earth."

This is an incredibly powerful statement which demands faith in Jesus Christ, validating His power and authority in the lives of Christians and their commitment to Him. This verse acts as a clear claim to Christ's omnipotence, and therefore His deity. If Christians do not believe this, complete faith does not exist. Jesus is very clear about His power and authority in the world – it is complete and total from the beginning of time (John 1:1-3, Col 1:16-18). Thus, Christ's power and authority urges us to act.

2. All Nations -Territory (19a): "Go ye therefore, and teach all nations..."

The Great Commission is unique, with global scope and effective until the Second Coming of our Lord Jesus Christ. Here the authority is given to Apostles who represented Christ & Church worldwide without national boundaries and the time extends until His Second Coming. The local church is commissioned to accomplish a specific task in the territory assigned. Therefore, the church is responsible for the spiritual life of the people living locally and globally. The commission emphasizes that the church has to "**GO & MAKE DISCIPLES**" without any boundaries. Thus, Jesus calls all His followers to act and share the Good News of salvation throughout the world. Are you ready to Go and share the Gospel with the lost and unreached.

3. All Things – Task: (v20a): “*Teaching them to observe all things whatsoever I have commanded you.*”

Jesus provides specific direction with affirmation to His followers. Christians are commanded to teach others about Jesus Christ and the entirety of His truth. The emphasis in this verse is not going or baptizing or teaching; but making disciples by teaching them to observe all things. We can't profess Christ as Saviour and Lord, while rejecting certain of His teachings. We need to take caution not to deviate from the focus – the very nucleus of the Gospel – by doing other things. The gospel must be the focal point in Missions and Evangelism, whether locally or globally.

4. Always With You – Promise of His presence (20b): “*....lo, I am with you alway, even unto the end of the world. Amen.*”

This commission is also unique because of a special promise of the presence of the Lord, which is not to the distant future, but in all times – past, present and future. Hence, as we teach Christ's truths, we can be confident in faith that Jesus Christ will support us. This fact has proven trustworthy throughout the centuries as millions of believers have heard, accepted and shared the Good News of Jesus Christ. Yes, Christ has ascended back to heaven, but He is present by the power of the Holy Spirit in every believer at all times.

Conclusion:

Thus, the Lord Jesus Christ calls us all to step out in faith and spread the Good News. This is faith in action! People who obey this command change their spiritual lives forever! We could be spreading the Good News to a neighbour or moving to another country to reach the people there. We could be sharing with less fortunate kids down the street or spreading the Word in our own neighbourhood. Wherever we are, every faithful Christian is compelled through obedience to share the Gospel. If you're a believer in Jesus Christ, where has He called you to go? Who has God put on your heart to share the gift of salvation? What small or large steps can you take, with the knowledge that Christ will be by your side, “*to make disciples of all the nations*”? The places and people who need to hear the Gospel are everywhere! This great commission is packaged with a great promise that “*He is with us always, even unto the end of the world.*” Here we are expected to obey in order to receive this great blessing. Let these words exhort and encourage every one of us to take the Gospel seriously and serve Him in our respective capacity and vicinity. May God bless you abundantly.

SHORTER CATECHISM QUESTION 92

Q: What is a sacrament?

A: A Sacrament is an holy ordinance instituted by CHRIST, wherein, – by sensible signs – Christ, and the benefits of the New Covenant, are represented, sealed, and applied to believers.

Comments:

We are here taught that the marks of a sacrament are: 1. That it is appointed by Christ; 2. That it is a way of teaching the gospel by outward signs. Its uses are three in number: 1. To represent the gospel to us, or teach it plainly; 2. To seal the gospel to us, or confirm our faith in it; 3. To apply the gospel to us, or bring it home to our hearts. The word sacrament is derived from a Latin word, which signified the sacred oath of fidelity to his commander, which the soldier took on entering the army for the service of his country. In a Christian sense, it means the vow of fidelity and obedience to Christ which is taken when we enter the Church. This vow was taken for us in Baptism, when we were infants. In the Lord's Supper, we take it upon ourselves.
