BIBLICAL FEAR AND OBEDIENCE

In one of my daily devotions some time ago, I read about a man who could not sleep because as soon as he slipped into sleep, he would have the sensation of falling out of bed or from some great height. He feared that he would die and he imagined himself falling into a bottomless pit. Then, one evening as he was strolling through a cemetery, he saw this inscription on a tombstone: "Underneath Are The Everlasting Arms". This is taken from Deuteronomy 33:27 and the verse says: "*The eternal God is thy refuge, and underneath are the everlasting arms.*" Indeed, the Christian need not fear and it is a comfort to believers in the Lord Jesus for Psalm 23:4, "*Yea, though I walk through the valley of the shadow of death, I will fear no evil; for thou art with me.*"

Human Fears

Fear is an emotion that protects us from threats in our environment and this "protective" fear is given by God and is a good thing. But there are three top fears that do not come from God. These are:

- Failure – This takes the top spot and it rules our action and decisions. It governs what we do and how we do them. Some have reacted by procrastinating, or not doing anything to make things worse or better. Others with resignation reasoned, 'I am just not good enough' or 'What's the use of trying?' But we have the victory through Christ. Ephesians 3:20 tells us "*Now unto him that is able to do exceeding abundantly above all that we ask or think, according to the power that worketh in us*".
- Rejection – This social fear is so great that it influences people to do things they never imagine they could do in their right mind. Acknowledgment or acceptance by others validates us socially within a society. It keeps us from doing things that are socially unacceptable. But sometimes it hinders us from doing what is right. The Bible tells us that our Lord suffered rejection Isaiah 53:³ *He is despised and rejected of men.* He knows what it is like. There is now no condemnation and He is working in us to conform us to the image of Jesus Christ [Romans 8:1, 29]. What a comforting thought!
- Death – Surprisingly, this is not man's greatest fear. We all know that everyone will have to face it. It is just a matter of time. It has been said that our fear of death is tied to the fear of the unknown. Many don't know what will happen to us when we leave this world. Jesus comforted His disciples in John 14:1- 4 and the assurances are as certain today as they had been then.

Our Lord Jesus has conquered all these. As Christ's disciples, we are to replace them with Godly fear which is linked to obedience.

Biblical Fear and Obedience

Deuteronomy 6:1-2 *"Now these are the commandments, the statutes, and the judgments, which the LORD your God commanded to teach you, that ye might do them in the land whither ye go to possess it: That thou mightest **fear** the LORD thy God, to **keep** all his statutes and his commandments, which I command thee, thou, and thy son, and thy son's son, all the days of thy life; and that thy days may be prolonged."*

The Christian must have a reverential fear for our awesome God. It is this fear that leads us to obey Him. The link between godly, or reverential, fear and obedience is a continual theme throughout the Old Testament. We fear the Lord by obeying Him in keeping his statutes and commandments. It is a conscious obedience to God's commands as given in His Word.

In Psalm 36, David tells the transgression of the ungodly that has no fear of God and his wonder at God's mercy and grace. The ungodly has no fear of Him. In contrast, Psalm 112 and Psalm 128 describe the blessedness of the man who fears God and obeys His command. Read both of these Psalms and let your heart rejoice and delight in obeying God's word. Let them be your source of encouragement.

Finally, let us hear from the book of Ecclesiastes. Having seen the vanities of life and after all the instructions, the writer has this to say, Eccl 12:¹³ *Let us hear the conclusion of the whole matter: Fear God, and keep his commandments.*

Keep his commandments – in simple terms, obey God. The fear of the Lord is the principle of obedience. This is so essential that Charles Haddon Spurgeon has this to say, "No man is really saved unless he is in his heart obedient to Christ". One writer said, "Obedience is the fruit of the tree of which the fear of God is the root". We cannot rightly obey God if we not fear Him, if we do not honor, reverence and love Him.
