FAITH AND OBEDIENCE

Rom 1:5 *“By whom we have received grace and apostleship, for obedience to the faith among all nations, for his name”*

Rom 16:26 *“But now is made manifest, and by the scriptures of the prophets, according to the commandment of the everlasting God, made known to all nations for the obedience of faith”*

Hebrews 11:1 *“Now faith is the substance of things hoped for, the evidence of things not seen”.*

Faith

What exactly is faith? The on-line Merriam-Webster dictionary defines it as “strong belief or trust in someone or something.” Hebrews 11:1 gives us more details. It is the substance of things hoped for. In other words it is based on someone or something tangible [substance] for what we want but have not received. Therefore, we hoped for it. For example, let’s say that you are preparing for an important assignment. You have confidence in yourself and trust in your abilities that if you work hard and put in effort you will succeed in getting what you want. Confidence is an element of faith and in this case the object of your faith is yourself.

There is a parallel in the spiritual realm and what the author of Hebrews is referring to is persevering or saving faith. The object of our faith is anchored in God who *“is able to do exceeding abundantly above all that we ask or think, according to the power that worketh in us”* (Eph 3:20). Does this matter? Yes, absolutely. Many times, we hear Christians exhorting one another to have more faith. They may even chide another as faithless when one expresses doubt. But more important than having faith, we need to ask what our faith is based on. For faith to have any value, the object it is based on is important.

I came across an illustration which I found insightful. If you were taking a flight to Paris, you would probably look for an airline with good track records. You want to be sure that the plane would be fueled, mechanically reliable, the pilot trained and the flight would leave at the time you chose. You also want to be sure the airport security is adequate that no terrorists would get on board. Your faith is useful in getting you on the plane; however, is NOT going to get you to Paris. What actually gets you to Paris is the plane, the pilot and good airport security and the fact that you act on it. So what matters is the object of your faith – is it reliable? If our faith is based on the wrong object, it does not matter whether you have faith or not.

Faith has been likened to our muscle. We need to exercise it to build it up. Polycarp was a 2nd-century Christian bishop of Smyrna. He was martyred for his Christian beliefs. Tradition and history recorded that this was what he said when burned at the stake. “Eighty and six years I have served Him, and He has done me no wrong, how then can I blaspheme my King and Savior?” Polycarp’s faith was built on his King and Savior and he had experienced his goodness and mercy for 86 years of his life. We need to start remembering God’s goodness and mercy in our lives. Pray and thank God in your daily quiet time with Him.

Obedience

In Rom 1: 5 and 16:26, Paul explains how faith and obedience are related. This must be of enormous importance because Paul said this at the beginning and repeated it again at the end of his Epistle. John Piper in his exposition on these two verses said that the gospel produces the obedience that come from faith. Other commentators have taken this to mean that faith produces obedience to Jesus Christ. Our obedience exalts God and glorifies Him. When we live in obedience to God, our lights shine before men and we glorify our Father which is in Heaven (Matt 5:16).

It is not easy to be obedient to our Lord and Savior in a sinful world. We constantly struggle with the world, our flesh and the Devil. Obedience has to be developed and God has promised us help. One of the reasons of our lack of obedience is unbelief. Our first parents doubted God's word and chose to believe what Satan accused God was doing is to deprive them of something good. We will also be tested to keep trusting God especially when bad things happen to us. In Mark 9:14-28, Jesus Christ healed a boy possessed by an impure spirit. Even his disciples were chided because of their lack of prayer and fasting. The father of the child immediately confessed his unbelief, repented in tears and asked Jesus for help. We can ask God for help and He will supply us our needs according to His riches in glory (Phil 4:19).

Conclusion

Every day, we need to live in dependence on our Lord and thank Him for the salvation that He has given to us. Our gratefulness result in faith in our Lord, Jesus Christ and enables us to trust in His goodness. We choose to obey Him and as we do so, we glorify and exalt our God and Heavenly Father.
