GROWING SPIRITUALLY AS A CHURCH

The book of Acts tells us about the beginning of the Church under the powerful influence of the Holy Spirit. The early Church grew exponentially when Christians devoted themselves to certain practices or activities which enabled them to grow in their relationship with the Lord. This can be seen most clearly in Acts 2:42-47. These early Christians devoted themselves to the following activities (some would called "spiritual disciplines"): the apostle's teaching, fellowship, prayer, worship and service (benevolence).

- 1. **God's Word**. Jesus said "It is written, Man shall not live by bread alone, but by every word that proceedeth out of the mouth of God." (Matt 4:4) Again, "All scripture is given by inspiration of God, and is profitable for doctrine, for reproof, for correction, for instruction in righteousness: That the man of God may be perfect, thoroughly furnished unto all good works." (2 Tim 3:16-17). All godly Christians in the past have been people of the Bible, literally Bible soaked reading, meditating, teaching, preaching and sharing His word. (1 Tim 4:13; 2 Tim 2:15; Josh 1:8, Ps 1:1-2, Ps 119:11). Spiritual growth comes from knowing and obeying God's word. "Thy word is a lamp unto my feet, and a light unto my path." (Ps 119:105) Have you been reading and obeying His word?
- 2. **Fellowship**: The early Church regularly spent time together. Close fellowship and sharing of common bond in the Lord, is the means God uses to bring us closer to each other. "Be kindly affectioned one to another with brotherly love; in honour preferring one another." Rom 12:10 and "And let us consider one another to provoke unto love and to good works: Not forsaking the assembling of ourselves together, as the manner of some is; but exhorting one another: and so much the more, as ye see the day approaching." Heb. 10:24-25. A single lighted coal quickly becomes extinguished when it is separated from all the coals in a burning furnace. Likewise, it is easy to drift away from Him if we get drawn away by the busyness of life and neglect the meeting together of believers as exhorted by His word to us above. Why not join a fellowship group today?
- 3. **Prayer (Fasting):** Prayer is essential for a healthy relationship with the Lord as breathing is to our body. It is through prayer that we commune with Him either privately or corporately. Prayer is the expression of trust, confession, thanksgiving, praise, adoration and worship. It can include fasting in which we give up something eg. food, in order to draw closer to the Lord. As an aside, instead of food-fast why not include a techno-fast which is to abstain from using your cell phone, TV, radio, etc. See Col 4:2. It is said that "more prayers are offered by soldiers in trenches than worshippers in the Church." Unless we realize that we are in spiritual warfare with Satan, we will never pay heed to prayers. How often do you pray? Why not attend prayer meeting on Wednesday or Sunday?
- 4. Worship: We are exhorted to worship the Lord "in spirit and in truth." (Jn 4:23-24). Many sermons have been preached on the topic of true worship. It is more than singing a few songs or praising the Lord. Paul defines it for us in Rom 12:1-2 "I beseech you therefore, brethren, by the mercies of God, that ye present your bodies a living sacrifice, holy, acceptable unto God, which is your reasonable service. And be not conformed to this world: but be ye transformed by the renewing of your mind, that ye may prove what is that good, and acceptable, and perfect, will of God." True worship is God centred and only reserved for Him alone. It not focused on man or entertainment driven. True worship involves the giving of our whole being, our attitude and motives to God for His glory and honour. Have you worship the Lord "in spirit and in truth"?

5. **Service:** Ministering to the needs of others in Church is never easy, that is why we are told to "*let us consider one another to provoke unto love and to good works*" (Heb. 10:24). Each of us needs to exercise our gift(s) for the edification of the body of Christ. Paul's instruction to Titus is timely "*This is a faithful saying, and these things I will that thou affirm constantly, that they which have believed in God might be careful to maintain good works. These things are good and profitable unto men.*" (Titus 3:8) And "*And let ours also learn to maintain good works for necessary uses, that they be not unfruitful.*" (Titus 3: 14) We need Christians to devote themselves to do what is good and profitable in the Lord. Are you serving the Lord in this Church? Why not?

Summary A preacher once said "Many people are entering into the Kingdom of God but not all are living for the Kingdom of God." We are grateful for the gift of salvation but how easy we drift from the path of discipleship through neglect and indulgences in the world. When we follow the examples of the early Church we will grow spiritually.

The aim of "spiritual disciplines" is not for self glory but to grow in godliness and be Christ-like. Paul told Timothy "... exercise thyself rather unto godliness. For bodily exercise profiteth little: but godliness is profitable unto all things, having promise of the life that now is, and of that which is to come." (1 Tim 4:7b-8) We strive to foster and to deepen our relationship with the Lord in accordance to His word. We reject those worldly teachings or philosophies eg. New Age movement, transcendental meditation, eastern mysticism, which are focused on self and not on the truth of God.

Let us not remain as spiritual infants but let us grow in spiritual maturity with the help of His word and the Holy Spirit. Let us follow the examples of the early Church by practicing these "spiritual disciplines." May God help us to grow more and more to be like the Lord Jesus Christ. Amen.

SHORTER CATECHISM QUESTION 19

Comments:

We are told that we have, in consequence, no longer that intercourse with God which Adam enjoyed, but are living under his displeasure, and therefore exposed to all the sorrows of this life, the pangs of death, and the pains of hell for ever. This is the condition in which we all are by nature; and, unless God had taken pity on us, this is the condition in which we should all have remained.
