PRAYER IN THE LIFE OF A CHILD OF GOD

The Bible tells us the importance of prayer. It is central in the life of a child of God. Jesus before he ascended to heaven commanded his disciples to pray in anticipation of the trials they would be facing. They would need much fortitude and obedience during those times of need.

R.C. Sproul, a Calvinist theologian wrote “Obedience unlocks the riches of the Christian experience. Prayer prompts and nurtures obedience, putting the heart into the proper “frame of mind” to desire obedience.” In simple terms, prayer and obedience work in a virtuous cycle.

Yet there is widespread prayerlessness among Christians. We rather tweet than pray in our busy schedules. Empirical studies tell us everyone in our modern society has less and less solitude. We need to unplug ourselves from emails, whatsApp messages and tweets. This has not included the numerous blogs and professional subscriptions some of us have in both our secular work and even Christian activities. This may lead to the danger of identifying Christian activities with intimacy with God. There is no moment of solitude with God and even self and this can result in decline in spiritual health. We pray only when we need help and we do need help when we realize our hopeless estate.

Why pray?

In his book on *Prayer* by Timothy Keller, he told the story of the illustration his wife used on him:

Imagine you were diagnosed with such a lethal condition that the doctor told you that you would die within hours unless you took a particular medicine – a pill every night before going to sleep. Imagine that you were told that you could never miss it or you would die. If that was the case, she said, you would never miss the medication. You would never say, I was too tired, or, I didn’t get to it, or, I was watching a movie, and I didn’t leave time. You never would do that. [page 9]

Does prayer change anything?

I find the answer given by R.C. Sproul especially illuminating. Someone had asked him that question in a slightly different manner: “Does prayer change God’s mind?” His answer brought storms of protest when he simply said “No.” But when it was worded “Does prayer change things?”, He said “Of course!” The protest arose from the word *repent* in Jonah 3:10 in which the Bible says that God repents. In using the concept of repentance here, the Bible is describing God who is a Spirit, in what theologians call “anthropomorphic” language. God does not repent in the way we would repent; otherwise God would have sinned and would need a saviour Himself. The Hebrew word *nacham*, translated “repent” in King James Version, means “comforted” or “eased”. God was comforted and felt at ease and therefore He revoked the sentence of judgment He had imposed. Another version used the word “relent” but it does not quite capture the full meaning of what is expressed by the Hebrew text.

The conclusion is that the mind of God does not change and God does not change. Things change and they changed according to His sovereign will, which He exercises through secondary means. Prayer is one of the means He uses to bring things to pass and that is one good reason why we should pray and pray unceasingly (1 Thess 5:17).

An example from our Lord

The common understanding is that “Son of God” implies his deity—which it does — and that “Son of Man” implies his humanity. No human has ever a more profound understanding of sovereignty and at the same time prayed more effectively than Jesus. This is recorded for us in Jesus’ prayer at the Garden of Gethsemane [Matt 26:36-46]. This is captured succinctly in v39, when He requested for an option and when the request was denied, he bowed to the Father’s will. The reason we pray is because we believe in God’s sovereignty to order things according to His purpose and our prayers can change things.

In summary, we look at the two reasons for praying in Jonathan Edwards’ sermon titled, “The Most High, a Prayer-Hearing God”:

First, with respect to *God*, prayer is but a sensible acknowledgment of our dependence on him to his glory. As he has made all things for his own glory, so he will be glorified and acknowledged by his creatures. And it is fit that he should require this of those who would be the subjects of his mercy ... [it] is but a suitable acknowledgment of our dependence on the power and mercy of God for that which we need, and but a suitable honor paid to the great Author and Fountain of all good.

Second, with respect to *ourselves*, God requires prayer of us ... Fervent prayer many ways tends to prepare the heart. Hereby is excited a sense of our need, ... whereby the mind is more prepared to prize [his mercy] ... Our prayer to God may excite in us a suitable sense and consideration of our dependence on God for the mercy we ask, and a suitable exercise of faith in God’s sufficiency, that so we may be prepared to glorify his name when the mercy is received.
