READING THE SCRIPTURE

Introduction

The Bible is a library of books - sixty-six books in all. The way to read the Bible is actually to read it. You, as a believer, will not advance one step spiritually until you start reading it. Reading through the Bible requires developing a plan of daily reading that holds events and prophecies of the Old Testament in perspective with the heart of divine revelation as embodied in the Lord Jesus Christ.

Why Read the Bible Through?

Reading all of the Bible is a worthy endeavour because *“all Scripture is given by inspiration of God”* and all Scripture is *“profitable for doctrine, for reproof, for correction, for instruction in righteousness”* (2 Tim. 3:16).

The chief object of reading and studying the Scripture is not the amount read or even the reading itself. The purpose is to know God. It is not to pacify our consciences that we are obeying our minister’s exhortations and reading the Scriptures. Although we may never understand all of the mysteries of God’s Word, we must seek out the message, the truth of all Scripture *“that the man of God may be perfect, thoroughly furnished unto all good works”* (2 Tim. 3:17).

The Bible reveals God’s nature in its multifaceted forms. We need to gain the panoramic view of God’s power, wrath, love, mercy, wisdom and greatness to begin to understand that He is the immutable *“I am”* of Exodus that says, *“This is My beloved Son, in whom I am well pleased”* (Matt. 3:17). Reading through the Bible brings out the awesome wonder of God as He speaks to and loves the humanity He created. To see the whole massive movement of biblical thought, the Scriptures need to be read frequently and from Genesis to Revelation.

As we study the profound complexity of the nature of God as seen in both Old and New Testaments, we develop a clearer understanding of what God desires in our relationships to Him and to others. The Christian must be content with nothing less. He will not understand the individual verses unless he has the framework of knowledge which a larger acquaintance with Scripture provides. The more he reads, the more comprehensible the Bible becomes. And when we allow the Holy Spirit to speak to us through God’s Word, our reading crosses from mere enjoyment to life transformation.

Suggestions for Reading the Bible Through

The Bible is the inspired Word of God. Just as the Holy Spirit was present in the writing of Scripture, so must He be present in our reading of the Word. We can read the Bible without the leadership of the Holy Spirit and still learn Bible facts. But we will never gain insights into the truth and application of God’s Word until we pray the Holy Spirit to open our minds and reveal His truth to us (Psa. 119:18). Each day as you start to read, pray that God’s Holy Spirit will aid you to understand what you read and apply the truth to your own life.

Set aside a definite time every day to read the Bible. The beginning of the day is best. Consider that time as a daily appointment with God and keep that appointment faithfully. No matter how you feel, read from the Bible every day. It always has a message for readers. Read the Scripture intentionally, without letting the pressures of predetermined time limits cause you to hurry.

Use Bible reading/study helps such as commentaries, concordances, Bible dictionaries, and Bible atlases. These resources should enrich your study but should never take the place of reading the Bible itself. Do not be disturbed if you do not understand some passages. Sometimes further reading or consulting a study guide may clarify the problem. Rely on the Holy Spirit to guide you into a growing, deepening understanding of God and His World.

You may want to keep a notebook or a journal as you read the Bible through. Record what you read and any observations or insights you gain. Writing down or paraphrasing what you read will help you remember and apply God's Word in life situations.

How to Read the Bible Through

A balanced reading of the Bible calls for reading the Old and New Testament simultaneously. Here are five approaches for reading through the Bible.

1. Place a bookmark in the Bible at three places: Genesis, Job, and Matthew. By reading one chapter from each of these sections every day, you will read the Old Testament once and the New Testament twice in about eighteen months.
2. Read one Bible chapter a day and you will read the entire Bible in three years and three months.
3. Read three Bible chapters every weekday and five chapters on Sundays, and you will read the entire Bible in less than a year.
4. In January and February, read Genesis through Deuteronomy. In March and April, read all of the New Testament. In May and June, read Joshua through Esther. In July August, read Job through Song of Solomon. In September and October, reread all of the New Testament. In November and December, read Isaiah through Malachi.

Read the Bible Throughout Your Life

The reading and study of God's Word is a lifelong endeavour that never grows old. Once you have read the Bible through, do it again. Choose different reading plans and schedules. Every time you read through God's Word, new and meaningful truths are brought to light.

The Bible holds the answer to humanity's past, present, and future. It is a wellspring of wisdom and divine instruction that never runs dry. Draw from this spring daily and find direction and purpose for your life as a believer.
