SHORTER CATECHISM QUESTION 29

Comments:

Having seen, in the previous questions, how salvation has been brought within our reach, we now come to learn the way in which we may become possessed of it. In this answer we are told, that while it is Christ who has purchased redemption for us, it is the Holy Spirit who puts us actually in possession of it.

The Vibrant Life and Doctrine of A Reformed Church – Part 1

The BP Church & The Reformed Faith

By the sovereign will of God, Dr Carl McIntire and others founded the Bible Presbyterian Church on 4 June 1937 in the US in the midst of growing liberalism and modernism in the US. The BP Church is a Reformed church committed to propagation of the pure gospel and the defence of the faith (Jude 3, 4). The term "Reformed" is a historical and theological term that goes back almost five centuries. It refers to a period when the church underwent a historic Reformation in attempting to return Christianity to the authority of Scripture. The desire of the Reformation was to recover and to return to God's Word and to bring the church back into accord with the teachings of His Word that was neglected for almost 1000 years. Led by Pre-Reformers like John Huss, Wycliffe, The Waldensians, later Martin Luther, Ulrich Zwingli, John Knox and John Calvin, the Reformers studied the Word, and they exposed the errors of the medieval Roman church and started what is Biblical Protestantism today.

The Reformers' Teaching

Martin Luther (and other Reformers) in the 16th century Protestant Reformation rediscovered the truth of justification by faith alone and by the preaching and teaching of the Word of God, he convinced the church that man was saved by God's grace alone through faith alone. He believed that all teachings and doctrines should be based upon Scripture alone. Coupled with the works of Calvin and later Knox, Zwingli, Bullinger and Beza, these Reformed theologians recognized the clear teaching of Scripture that Jehovah is a sovereign God.

They believed that God was not an idle viewer but was an active Governor in all of nature and the affairs of man and that "He who keepeth Israel will neither slumber nor sleep." (Psalm 121:3). They taught, as did the apostle Paul, that "in Him we live and move and have our being" (Acts 17:28). They were sure that an almighty God ruled over his creation sovereignly and that all events came to pass by God's design, for everything is according to the purpose of Him who works all things according to the counsel of His will (Ephesians 1:11).

The Sovereignty of God

The supreme Creator of all has the right to do whatever he wants with the peoples of the earth. The Reformers believed not only that he had that right but that he exercised his will righteously and that this principle was clearly taught in Scripture. "And all the inhabitants of the earth are reputed as nothing: and he doeth according to his will in the army of heaven, and among the inhabitants of the earth: and none can stay his hand, or say unto him, What doest thou?" (Daniel 4:35)

His sovereignty was especially realized in the salvation of the elect (Ephesians 1:4,5). The teaching of the French Reformer John Calvin in Geneva emphasized the sovereignty and providence of God especially in salvation and His work is often summarized in the *"Five Points of Calvinism."* The simple acronym "TULIP" formulated at the Synod of Dort by Reformed theologians from 1618-1619 to respond to the defective doctrine of the 5 points of Arminius, as a defence of the faith.

A Summary of the Reformed Faith

The Early Protestant leaders defended the scriptural teachings of the absolute sovereignty of God against those who denied the power of God. Some felt that salvation was at least in part by their own hands and undermined the authority of Scripture. They see it as a cooperative effort and that we need to do our part in our salvation. The Reformed Church from the ministry of John Calvin valiantly proclaimed the biblical answer to this by teaching the Reformed faith that exalts God alone and taught the total inability of man to save himself. Consider the 5 points below which must be taken as a coherent theological whole and not in part.

Total Depravity

Here we believe that Man in his fallen, sinful state, and he does not receive the things of the Spirit of God, for they are foolishness to him; nor can he know them, because they are spiritually discerned (1 Corinthians 2:14). God's own assessment of the descendants of Adam's fallen race was the wickedness of man was great in the earth, and that every intent of the thoughts of his heart was only evil continually (Genesis 6:5; 8:21). All the "good" that man thinks he does throughout his life is but "filthy rags" (Isaiah 64:6). What was true of King David is also true of us all. We must realize that we were, brought forth "in iniquity and in sin my mother conceived me" (Psalm 51:5). The natural man is not sick, not terminally ill, but he is spiritually DEAD. As Paul says, "And you hath he quickened, who were dead in trespasses and sins; Wherein in time past ye walked according to the course of this world, according to the prince of the power of the air, the spirit that now worketh in the children of disobedience: Among whom also we all had our conversation in times past in the lusts of our flesh, fulfilling the desires of the flesh and of the mind; and were by nature the children of wrath, even as others" (Ephesians 2:1-3).

Unconditional Election

The Bible teaches that God has predestinated or chosen "us in Him before the foundation of the world, that we should be holy and without blame before Him in love" (Ephesians 1:4, Romans 8:29-30). We cannot choose our own eternal destiny He does (John 15:16). This means that those who will be saved are those who have been chosen to be saved by the sovereign Lord - "I will have mercy on whom I have mercy" (Romans 9:15). He does not base his election on any condition within man, "lest anyone should boast" (Ephesians 2:9). And it is not by man's choice or our initiative at all but God's alone.
